



# FRASER GRAIN TERMINAL

## THE GATEWAY TO THE PACIFIC

Fraser Grain Terminal (FGT) is adjacent to DPW Fraser Surrey on Vancouver Fraser Port Authority land in Surrey, British Columbia. The facility ships bulk grain products including wheat, barley, oil seeds, pulses and other specialty grains. FGT's throughput is 3.5 million tonnes per annum (Mt/a); the terminal's total capacity is over 4 MMT.

FGT receives grains by rail and transfers its agri-products to storage silos with some product loaded directly to vessels. From storage silos, most of the grain is loaded onto cargo ships and remaining products are transferred to containers, railcars or trucks. The terminal will load approximately between 80 and 100 bulk vessels per year (approx. 1-3 vessels per week), including Panamax, Supramax and Handy-size vessels.

- Transfer system comprising one transfer tower and fully enclosed above-ground conveying equipment with a built-in dust suppression system
- 25 above-ground steel storage silos
- Three shiploaders with choke fed and cascading type telescopic spouts to reduce dust during vessel loading
- Semi-loop rail track
- Rail unloading station
- Container loading equipped with 2 - 90 degree tilters which provide highly efficient loading of 20' bulk containers
- Truck loading
